



Amgen Teach uses face-to-face training workshops and online events to provide educators with the skills and confidence to encourage students to learn science.

Funded by the Amgen Foundation and coordinated by European Schoolnet, Amgen Teach is designed to deepen student interest and achievements in science by strengthening the ability of life science secondary school teachers to use inquiry-based teaching strategies in the classroom. The programme was launched in 2014 and has to date reached over 4,000 teachers, indirectly benefitting an estimated 530,000 students.

During the school year 2018-2019, the programme will offer face-to-face training workshops in nine countries and an international Massive Online Course (MOOC), complemented by an online community of practice and national online webinars.

During the 2018-19 school year, face-to-face trainings will target experienced teachers, who have previously participated in the programme. These teachers will also have the opportunity to apply to become Amgen Teach Expert Teachers. Selected teachers may also be invited to join a European Network of Amgen Teach Ambassadors, who will receive specialist training and act as national and international representatives of the programme.

In addition, Amgen offers a vast repository of online tools supporting IBSE education and facilitates regular exchanges between teachers. The programme is helping develop an ecosystem of innovative approaches to IBSE education in European schools.
